The Security Report was emailed and contained no significant events.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ries to approve the minutes as written from the September meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cravens. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

BEAUTIFICATION, Commissioner Chris von Allmen

<u>Dead Tree</u> - Reviewed dead tree in the Green Spring owned lot, at the request of the neighbor at 4619 Wolfspring Dr. adjacent to the lot. Confirmed that the tree is on Green Spring property. Received estimate from Kenny Jones, Louisville Tree service for 3100.00. The consensus of the commission was to proactively remove the dead tree

<u>Fall plantings</u> - decided to forgo the regular replacement of our summer annual plantings with fall mums. After reviewing trees and shrubs around the city, we will have to replace more dead loss than normal around the city and felt that this was priority for the budget.

<u>Tree City USA</u> - Arbor Day celebration at the fall festival. As part of the Fall festival celebration, a proclamation of our celebration of Arbor Day on Saturday October 11th was recognized. Our continued commitment to maintaining our Urban Forest and promoting tree health within the city. This will make 19 years as a Tree City!

CITY SERVICES, Commissioner Mike Faith

During this reporting period, City Services issued one dumpster permit and one deck building permit. Additionally, Rumpke experienced a service disruption affecting a few residents, which was resolved with a supplemental pickup.

09/26 – Issued permit D-250902 to residents @ 4519 Wolfspring Drive for dumpster.

10/03 – Rumpke missed a few residents' pickups. Rumpke sent a supplemental truck to resolve the misses.

10/14 - Permit B-250901 for deck replacement at 4519 Wolfspring Drive

FINANCE, Commissioner Stuart Ries

Income for September was \$974.15. Expenses for September were \$22,578.49. Major September expenses were Trash Collection (\$7,935.00) and Lawn Care (\$3813.80). The CD with Old National Bank was renewed for 5 months at an APR of 4.00%. The current value of the CD is \$152,547.49.

2025-2026 tax bills will be available on October 20,2025 and mailed no later than October 31,2025.

A discussion was held with investment advisors from Kentucky League Of Cities regarding investment of City funds that have been designated for future road paving projects. They will attend the November meeting to present options.

TRANSPORTATION, Commissioner Trevor Cravens

Two digital speed limit signs have been relocated. On is on the curve at Green Spring Drive and one is on Deepwood Drive.
