

MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY 15, 2026 MEETING OF THE GREEN SPRING COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order at 7:06 pm by Mayor John Morton. In attendance were City Commissioners Mike Faith, Chris von Allmen, Trevor Cravens, and Stuart Ries, along with City Attorney Chip Hayward and City Clerk Caryl Graf.

The Security Report was emailed and contained no significant events.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ries to approve the minutes as written from the December meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner von Allmen and passed with a unanimous vote.

BEAUTIFICATION, Commissioner Chris von Allmen

Contacted Pro-Turf to review landscape lighting and provide a plan and budget for correcting overgrowth and broken fixtures.

CITY SERVICES, Commissioner Mike Faith

Will speak with Rumpke about extending garbage collection contract one more year at 3% rate increase.

FINANCE, Commissioner Stuart Ries

Income for December was \$97,125.98. This includes \$96,230.42 from property tax receipts. Expenses for December were \$36,924.89. Major December expenses were trash collection (\$7,935.00) and snow removal (\$8,532.50).

2025 Property Taxes: 273 of 282 (96.8%) property owners have paid 2025 taxes. The 9 property owners who have not paid taxes have been mailed reminder letters. Tax liens will be filed in February on all properties with unpaid taxes.

All paperwork has been completed for KLC investment pool; waiting on Annuity to be cashed in.

TRANSPORTATION, Commissioner Trevor Cravens

No snow in 2026 so far.

Will begin to evaluate options for road repaving or resealing for future budgetary planning. This will involve requesting road condition assessments from multiple companies.

Commissioner Faith: Light out on Clipping Court; LG&E has been contacted but no action; Commissioner Cravens will reach out to them too.
