

## **MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 19, 2026 MEETING OF THE GREEN SPRING COMMISSION**

The meeting was called to order at 7:09pm by Mayor John Morton. In attendance were City Commissioners Mike Faith, Trevor Cravens, Chris von Allmen, and Stuart Ries, along with City Attorney Chip Hayward and City Clerk Caryl Graf.

Mayor Morton opened the meeting with comments regarding the November election:

The City of Green Spring November 2026 election seeks candidates for city commissioners.

The Mayor's position will also be on the ballot. Candidates need to have been a resident for at least one year. The above positions pay a yearly fee of \$2400.

The commission meets the third Thursday of each month at 7pm. The commissioners and the mayor have specific job duties that need to be fulfilled during the month. While the time constraints are minimal, being responsive to our residents is of the utmost importance.

Candidates must register by June 2, 2026.

A fee of \$50 is required that is reimbursed by the city for all applicants. Candidates will need the signatures of two registered voters who reside in Green Spring.

The Security Report was emailed and contained no significant events.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ries to approve the minutes as written from the February meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner von Allmen. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

### **BEAUTIFICATION, Commissioner Chris von Allmen**

Proturf has started edging beds and trimming ahead of season.

Dog stations waste was not removed promptly and ProTurf agreed to adjust billings.

Repair of damaged landscaping at Wolf Spring Dr. median will be assessed.

### **CITY SERVICES, Commissioner Mike Faith**

Three resident and code related items were addressed this month, including a driveway widening permit inquiry, one unpermitted dumpster placement that was corrected after Code Enforcement involvement, and one dumpster permit that was issued.

3/9/2026: Issued a dumpster permit for resident on Green Spring Drive.

3/16/2026: Notified of a dumpster placed at residence on Wolfspring Trace without a permit. Code Enforcement engaged. Contractor remedied.

3/18/2026: Resident on Fox Den Drive inquired about the permitting process for widening their driveway. Guidance provided on the process and next steps.

3/19/2026: Building permit issued to resident on Fox Den Drive for driveway repairs and negligible widening.

**FINANCE, Commissioner Stuart Ries**

Income for February was \$29,573.12. This includes \$26,095.38 from insurance premium receipts. Expenses for February were \$17,183.48. Major February expenses were trash collection (\$7,935.00) and snow removal (\$2,850.00).

**2024 Property Taxes**

The remaining delinquent tax bill has been paid in full. A lien release has been prepared. All 2024 tax bills have been paid in full.

**2025 Property Taxes**

There are two delinquencies for 2025 taxes.

**Kentucky League of Cities Investment Pool (KLCIP)**

The certificate of deposit with Old National Bank matured on March 1. This amount was deposited in the City's checking account and then transferred from checking to KLCIP for investment.

**2026-2027 Budget**

We will have the first reading of the 2026 budget at the April meeting. Please submit any special budget requests prior to the next meeting.

**TRANSPORTATION, Commissioner Trevor Cravens**

MSD Update – 4602 Deepwood Court – MSD came out to secure and assess for further repairs. Will be several months before they get to it. MSD service request 5540147 – can call for status.
